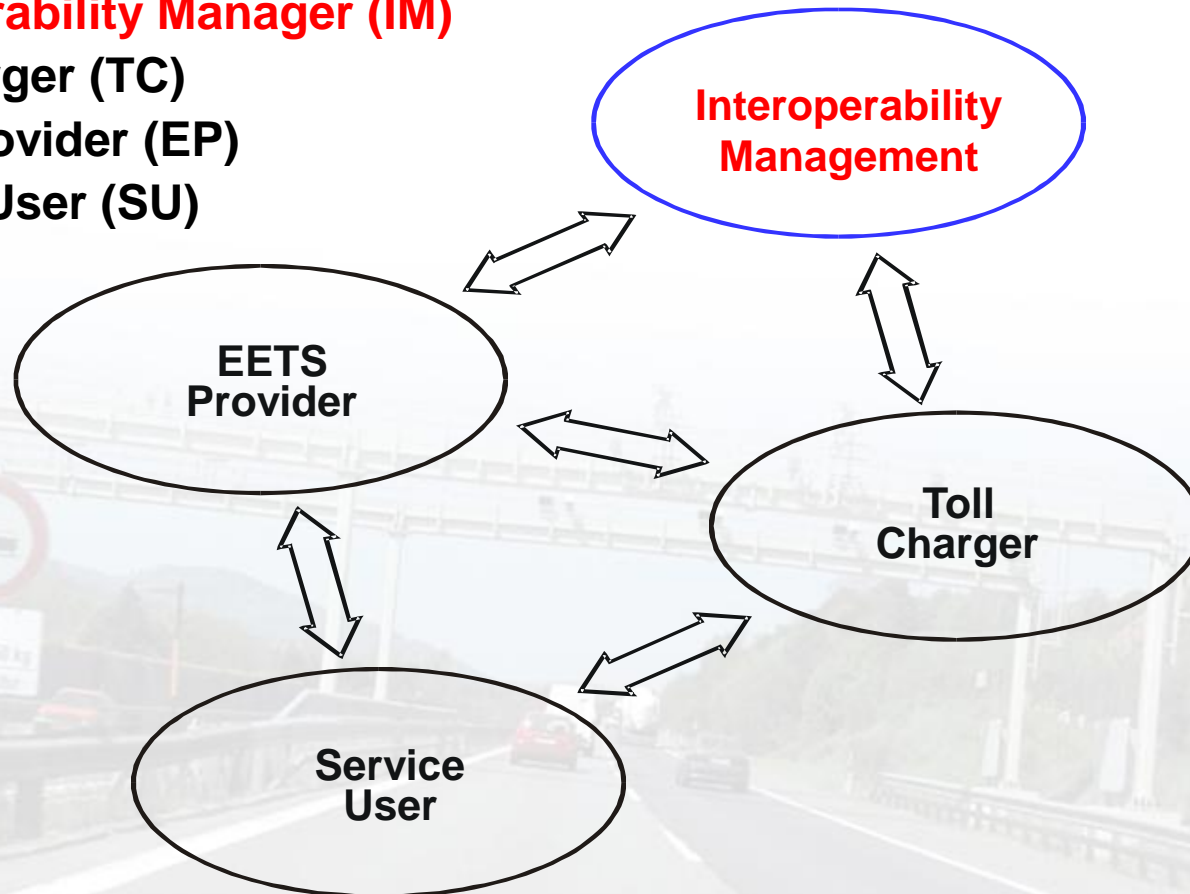

The CESARE Model

CESARE III identified the following roles within EETS:

- **Interoperability Manager (IM)**
- **Toll Charger (TC)**
- **EETS Provider (EP)**
- **Service User (SU)**



CESARE IV: Structure of IM

- IM based on a two-level structure (EC and Member States)
- Allocation of tasks to existing entities
- Detailed steps and responsibilities for certification procedures (equipment, registration)

CESARE IV vs. Decision

**Decision did not implement
the CESARE IV recommendations regarding IM**

Decision 750/2009/EC

- 27 National IM entities regulating at national basis the tasks of the EETS roles and additional entities (27 conciliation bodies, numerous notified bodies)
- No details for the needed exchange of information mechanism and application (EP and equipment suppliers)

CESARE IV:

- A coordinated pan European IM
- IM tasks in different entities (e.g. conciliation body, notified body)

CESARE IV: Recommendations

Additional recommendations for a legal framework:

- Specification of EETS interfaces:
 - Definition of Key Performance Indicators for EP
 - GNSS Standards
 - Security Standards
 - Data Exchange Standards
- Interoperability Management
 - Responsibility of Notified Bodies must be standardized
 - EP certification process
 - Conciliation rules for claims between TC and EP
